- **Next Steps:** External review and comments will be sought by October 4, 2024 | Final Co-host approval by November 1, 2024 | Accord Signing Ceremony at the Symposium on November 14, 2024.

The development and signing of the Mental Health and Addictions Accord will be a key outcome of the Symposium, as signatories commit to the stated principles and actions to promote mental well-being and combat substance misuse within our communities.
